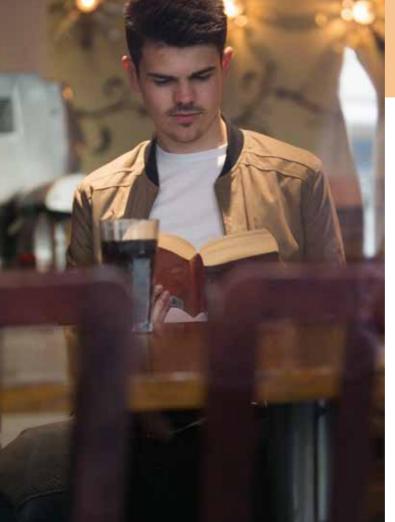
At City College we want to make you feel welcome and part of the College community as soon as you walk through the door.

STEP-IN

In your second week of term you will start your teaching timetable. In addition, during this time your group will be invited to join in a number of 'STEP' activities to support your transition into higher education. Whether you have come straight from A Levels or are returning to education for a career change, we want to make the transition as smooth as possible for you.

STEP activities may include:

- study skills support
- team building activities
- motivational talks
- subject specific masterclasses
- · budget management
- IT support
- site visits
- · talks from employers/industry experts.

TRAVEL

During term time, the College operates a FREE bus service running between the City Centre, Plymouth rail station and Kings Road (Stagecoach service 36). If you live further afield in Plymouth, Devon and Cornwall, you may be eligible for some financial assistance to help with travel costs.

Driving to College

There is a student car park with limited parking spaces available. Disabled parking is located by the main entrance (for blue badge holders) and there are some designated areas for motorcycle/moped parking. To park your car on-site, students must either purchase a parking permit (£10 per term) or pay and display on a daily basis (50p for four hours, £1 all day) until 5.00pm. You can purchase your car permit from the car park management company (TPS) via www.cityplym.ac.uk/help-advice/personal-support/travel/ and will need to include your student ID number on the application.

Please note: a permit does not guarantee you a parking space.

Charges apply for all parking spaces, including disabled spaces. Failure to have a permit or pay and display ticket on clear view will result in fines being imposed by the parking company. This also applies if you park in the staff parking areas with a student permit.

The College takes no responsibility regarding the parking charges/fines imposed by the parking company and encourages car sharing where possible.



College Free Bus

Until the end of September you can use the College free bus without showing your student ID card if you have not been issued it.

Cycling to College

The College provides a number of bike storage lockers which are available to rent on an annual basis. There is also a large bike shed where you can lock up your bike. The College accepts no responsibility for the loss or damage of your bike if you choose to use these facilities.

There are also showers and changing rooms available.

Throughout the year, the College works with local companies to provide bicycle skills and maintenance workshops and safety checks.



FOOD AND DRINK





The College has a number of places to buy food and drink. You can buy anything from a slice of pizza to fresh sandwiches or a three-course meal.

The College also offers a Breakfast Club for ALL students during term time so you can have a FREE healthy breakfast to start your day. If you are aged also get a free hot meal during the day (you will need to meet certain criteria).

Safeguarding - Being Safe at College

Childcare - Curious Kittens Day Nursery

If you are a parent, our on-site nursery will enable you to study knowing that your children are being looked after in a stimulating and caring environment.

Curious Kittens caters for children aged six months to school entry age, subject to availability.

Most students will be eligible for some help with childcare costs - the Student Funding team and Nursery staff will be able to offer advice on this.





Library

Find all the information and materials you need for your course or personal study in a variety of formats from print and media (including TV recordings) through to online resources, such as e-books, e-journals and databases.

Equipment can be borrowed to support classwork and extracurricular activities. Spaces in the library are provided for silent and group work.

Computers

You will receive a personalised computer log-in and e-mail account.

Your log-in gives you access to Student Central, your gateway to College information and campaigns, software packages, online resources, the internet, printing and course materials and activities on learning platforms including Moodle and Google.

There are computers throughout the College in classrooms, library and study areas, and printers in the library and across the College site. Some laptops and Chromebooks are available to borrow onsite.







BECOME AN HE STUDENT REP

Every year of every course has at least one Student Representative. Course Reps fulfil a valuable role, linking between the student body and the College.
